# **Guiding Principles**


Fair allocation of resources is guided by

- an effective contribution towards helping a person live as others do
- value for money, now and in the future
- **consistent**, principled and **equitable approach** across a diverse range of people
- decisions which reflect a **long term perspective**, noting people grow, age, develop, change over time

The Ministry is not able to meet *all* the identified needs of disabled people

# Find Your Way Around Your Equipment Manual

#### Section 2 Eligibility and Access Criteria

- 1.2 guiding principles
- 2.1 defines 'essential' and 'cost effective'
- 2.2 determines whether or not the person can be **considered** for EMS funding
- 2.3 outlines the **six Access Criteria** for services for funded equipment
- 2.4 and 2.5 outline the consideration for funding for those individuals who live in **long term** residential care
- Sections 10 and 11 relate to accreditations and what is considered in this accredited area of equipment when we review the Advice





## **Advisory Role**

Accessable administers the budget on behalf of the Ministry, and works with Assessors to establish:

- Eligibility:
  - a clear MOH **disability diagnosis**
  - an 'essential' need for at least 6 months, however, to make the proposed solution cost effective, as per 1.2 and 2.1, it is good to be able to consider the equipment in terms of long term benefit at least 6 months but preferably 1-2 years +
- Access: Meets the Access Criteria
- Sustainable: Suggested equipment provision that will meet a long term essential disability related need (EDRN)
- Alternatives: There are no other viable alternative options






# Completing an EMS Equipment Advice Request

#### **Stepping Stones of the EMS Process**





**Functional Loss** 

What is the person's functional loss resulting in the need for equipment and/or modifications?

- Clinical Profile Information
  - Person focused information
  - Information documented in the Functional Loss field is specific to the person and their disability/disabilities
  - Information is visible to all therapists working with the person



#### Main Issues

Description of the person's main issues/functional loss related to this request

- Main Issues:
  - Information in the Main Issues section is specific to the solution/s being recommended



#### Solutions

Proposed Solution

Alternative Options Considered/Trialled

- Solutions Section Alternative Options Considered/Trialled
  - brief summary of what you have
    considered/trialled and why is it not suitable
  - brief summary of any discussions with colleagues, suppliers



Additional Information

- Solutions Section Sustainability
  - describe the length of time the equipment solution will meet the need for
  - confirming sustainability helps to establish cost effectiveness
  - timeframe of anywhere from 6 months, up to 1-2 years



#### Bringing the need into focus through the Advice Request







### Other Information for a Well-rounded Advice Request



- Supporting documentation
- Cultural considerations
- Who has the need/issue being discussed with?



#### **Assessor Checklist for Equipment Advice**

- A clear disability diagnosis
- A clear long term and essential disability related need
- The Access Criteria the need/solution relates to
- Cost effectiveness considered
- Any other viable alternative options thoroughly explored
- □ A sustainable care/living situation
- A solution which is fairly typical, and if not, demonstrate your clinical reasoning
- A proposed solution that 1) reflects your clinical findings and, if needed, 2) outlines the client's preferences



# Tips for Completing your Service Request



### Tips for Completing your Service Request

- Standard MOH Criteria to establish EMS Eligibility
- Linking EMS Advice to a Service Request
- Delivery instructions/Collections upon delivery
- Supporting documents
- Referring Service Request to the Professional Advisory Team for review
